The History of Independence Day

Independence Day is a holiday celebrated each year on July 4th. Its origins date back to the 18th century and the American Revolution. America was originally a colony of Britain. The colonists argued and fought for their rights but the British refused. The Continental Congress voted in favor of independence from Britain. The delegates from the 13 colonies adopted the Declaration of Independence, a document drafted by Thomas Jefferson, to present to King George III. The British rejected their claim and they went to war.

In the pre-Revolutionary years, colonists held annual celebrations of the king's birthday.

After the British won the Battle of Yorktown in 1781, the colonists celebrated the end of the war.

For the first time, the colonists celebrated the end of the war.

John Adams on July 7, 1776 some promoted the idea of July 7 as an important date to celebrate. In 1870 the U.S. Congress made July 4th a federal holiday.
