Dumas next decided to write historical novels. His first novel was "The Countess of Salisbury." His most famous novels are "The Three Musketeers," "The Count of Monte Cristo" and "The Man in the Iron Mask."

Although his writing had earned him a great deal of money he spent it lavishly and fell into financial difficulties. King Louis-Philippe was ousted in a revolt and Dumas fled from the newly elected president and his creditors. He moved to Brussels and then lived in Russia.

Dumas died at the age of 68 possibly of a heart attack on 5 December 1870. His country house in France which he had to sell is now a museum.
